

### **Summer Academic Camp Program Policy**

The Haliwa-Saponi Tribal School is committed to providing intervention strategies to help students reach grade level proficiency.

A summer academic camp *will* be provided for students who are mandated to receive summer academic support under applicable requirements for Charter Schools from the State Board of Education and the Department of Public Instruction.

A summer academic camp *may* be provided for students in grades 1, 2, and 3 who are struggling with Reading, students in grades 4 and 5 who are not proficient on their End-of-Grade Assessments (EOG's) and have been retained one or more times already, students in grades 6-8 who are not proficient on their End-of-Grade Assessments (EOG's), any high school student who has not passed a required class for graduation for which there is an online credit recovery course, acceptable by the BOE. Recommendation for Participation in the program by a teacher/principal committee of at least three members is required.

Transportation may be available. If transportation is available, students will not necessarily be picked up at their homes but at designated bus stops. Pickup locations will be communicated at least one week prior to beginning of summer program.

Due to the intensive nature of the Summer Academic Camp Program, it is especially important to maintain excellent attendance and to be on time. Students may not miss more than eight cumulative hours, regardless of whether the absence is "excused." Every absence significantly impacts learning. Students will be required to make up all work related to absences. Tardies are defined as being late for class in the morning, returning late from a break, or leaving school early. Tardies will be factored into the above referenced eight-hour absence limit.

Students must maintain appropriate behavior during the Summer Academic Camp Program. Behavior standards and procedures that apply during the school year will apply during the Summer Academic Camp Program. Students dropped from a class for attendance or disciplinary reasons, will not receive credit for the course.

All policies and procedures set forth in the Haliwa-Saponi Tribal School's Parent/Student Handbook, except as otherwise stated in this policy, apply during the Summer Academic Camp Program.

Students will retest at the end of the summer camp program for readiness levels to determine if they have made sufficient progress to move forward. Reports will be sent out the first week of August to let parents know the placement of their child for the fall.

The Summer Academic Camp Program will comply with all applicable requirements of the State Board of Education and the Department of Public Instruction. Participation in the summer academic camp is voluntary and does not guarantee a student's promotion.
